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## JUDGE'S COPY OF SCENARIO INDIVIDUAL SCENARIO

While walking through the Ontario Science Centre, you happened to observe a maintenance person working on a large display. A few seconds later you hear a loud yell, When you respond to investigate, you find the worker kneeling in front of the display, obviously caught and drawn into the machine.

#### N.B.

There will be an announcement of times after the first 3 minutes and again at the final 2 minutes.

Note:

#### **INJURIES**

- Casualty is found on their knees, with both hands caught in the machine.
- Index fingers on both hands amputated by machine.
- Casualty hit forehead on the front of the machine as they were pulled in.
- Contusion in center of forehead with a very small 2 mm cut (bleeding slightly)
- Hands wrapped in a garbage bag.
- History of epilepsy, has been seizure-free for 5 years.
- Unconscious at beginning of scenario, regains consciousness during "Tap and Shout" or if not done, at the 3 minutes announcement
- Not currently on any medications.

#### **CASUALTY PROMPTS**

- Unconscious at beginning of scenario, regains consciousness during "Tap and Shout" or if not done, at the 3 minutes announcement
- Casualty was clearing a jam on the machine, got caught and pulled in.
- Casualty hit head and is feeling a little nauseous.
- History of epilepsy, has been seizure-free for 5 years.
- Not currently on any medications (since seizure free for 5 years).
- Casualty ate recently in the Science Centre cafeteria.
- Casualty has No Allergies

#### **PROPS**

- Chair or something to simulate the machine
- Garbage bag wrapped around the casualty's hands
- Simulated amputated fingers
- Casualty is wearing tyvec coveralls


#### JUDGES' PROMPTS

- Judge is available to call for 911 and perform traffic control at the scene, IF ASKED.
- Unconscious at beginning of scenario, regains consciousness during "Tap and Shout" or if not done, at the 3 minutes announcement
- Casualty is pale and sweaty.
- Casualty's skin is cool and clammy throughout scenario.
- Casualty's respirations are 25, regular and shallow throughout scenario
- Casualty's pulse is 110 regular and weak throughout scenario.
- Casualty's pupils are equal, 4 mm and reactive.
- Casualty is nauseous from the blow to the head.
- Casualty is unconscious at beginning of scenario then groggy and semi conscious.
